The Chamber Orchestra of Philadelphia Joins The Joybells of Melmark for a New CD and Free Holiday Concerts at The Kimmel Center on December 7

PHILADELPHIA, PA – The Chamber Orchestra of Philadelphia, a founding resident company of The Kimmel Center for the Performing Arts, will perform for the very first time with The Joybells of Melmark in two free holiday concerts on Sunday, December 7. The Joybells are led by two professional musical directors and features adult choir members with developmental disabilities playing a variety of handbells, chimes and percussion instruments. Gary White will conduct the join ensemble in a program of holiday music arranged by the Chamber Orchestra's music director Dirk Brossé.

The Joybells and the Chamber Orchestra of Philadelphia recently recorded a CD of timeless holiday music and Christmas carols, including Away in A Manger, Infant Holy, Jolly Old St Nicholas, Joy to the World, Silent Night, The Russian Dance from "The Nutcracker," Up on the Housetop and We Wish You a Merry Christmas. Visitors to the Kimmel Center are also invited to donate new or gently used winter coats, hats, gloves and scarves to be distributed to the neediest local communities. Collection boxes will be located in the lobby of the Kimmel Center from December 2, 2014 - January 1, 2015.

For almost forty-five years, The Joybells have performed selections of sacred, classical, popular and patriotic music at churches, schools, colleges and corporate and community events. The handbell choir has been honored to perform at the White House on three occasions and at a Pennsylvania gubernatorial inauguration. Members of The Joybells participate in programs at Melmark, a comprehensive multi-service agency, providing services for children and adults with autism, intellectual disabilities, brain injuries and other neurological and genetic diagnoses.

"Everyone at The Chamber Orchestra of Philadelphia is very excited about this collaboration," says their Executive Director Janelle McCoy. She explained how the concerts evolved. "We've nurtured a friendship with Melmark by hosting groups of special audiences at our open rehearsals. Last year, the Chamber Orchestra and Melmark decided to develop the relationship into a musical collaboration."

McCoy added, "Our Music Director Dirk Brossé orchestrated The Joybell's holiday repertoire for this season, which led to their first collaboration with an orchestra, a recording session and a private performance last September, and now, two free holiday performances at the Kimmel Center on December 7! The musical sounds The Joybells create are always gorgeous and fun. Whether you hear them in concert or on the new CD, this program is guaranteed to put listeners of any age in a holiday mood." Melmark President and CEO, Joanne Gillis-Donovan, Ph.D. says this concert series and CD recording is an extraordinary opportunity for The Joybells. "We are grateful to The Chamber Orchestra of Philadelphia for recognizing the talents of our adults," said Gillis-Donovan. "For the men and women of The Joybells to perform on a stage with world class musicians, it just says so much about their talents."
